

Grand Forks Foundation for Education IMPACT GRANTS

Funded by the Bill and Shirley Brown Endowment for Education

As the local school foundation, the Grand Forks Foundation for Education provides private support for new and enhanced educational opportunities in the Grand Forks Public Schools. Since 1991, the Foundation's Mini-Grants program has funded hundreds of classroom and district projects. In 2006, the Foundation added Impact Grants as an additional means of support. Impact Grants will provide larger awards, ranging from \$5,000 to \$15,000, for higher level projects in the Grand Forks Public Schools.

Criteria for Impact Grants: Impact Grants are a catalyst for ideas or projects that are capable of having a lasting influence on a district-wide curricular area or grade level, or on a significant portion of students or educators at one or more schools. Ideas or projects must have school district administrative approval.

Who can apply: Any educator or group of educators in the Grand Forks Public Schools.

Amount available: Up to 3 grants, each ranging from \$5,000 to \$15,000.

Application deadline: February 15. Applicants will be notified within about 45 days of the deadline. Ideas chosen for funding may be asked to submit additional information.

To apply for Impact Grants: Contact Foundation Executive Director Jenny Arel (call 787-4867 or email jenny.arel@gfschools.org) to briefly discuss your idea or project. If your idea or project fits the criteria for Impact Grants, you will be encouraged to submit a letter (no longer than two pages) to the Foundation. In the letter, *use sub-headings to outline the following information in the following order:* A description of your idea, and the need or problem that it seeks to address; a description of the main activities needed to implement your idea, and who you expect to be involved; the expected level of impact, and how impact will be measured; the amount of Impact Grant funds needed, including a list of what you expect to be the major cost elements; if other funds are already committed to your idea, and/or on-going funding will be needed to sustain it, tell about those funds. Letters must be signed by one applicant, who will serve as the contact person for the project, and must be signed by an administrator who has reviewed the project for prior approval.
